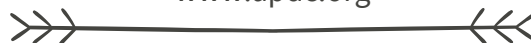

APDC's Victim Assistance is a community-based organization that supports underserved and underrepresented victims of crime in Colorado.

We serve diverse groups throughout the state who face challenges due to language, religious, and economic barriers.

Our services are available to all victims of crime regardless of race, nationality, sexual identity, citizenship status and/or disability.

VISION

Our vision is for our communities to be healthy and empowered.

FAQ

Do I have to be Asian to receive the services?

No. APDC's Victim Assistance department will assist all Victims of Crime regardless of race, nationality, sexual identity, religion and/or citizenship status and/or disability.

Do I have to have a police report?

No. Whether a police report is filed or a suspect is found guilty does not impact your services at APDC.

What type of crime victim do you assist?

All victims of crime are eligible for assistance through APDC's Victim Assistance departments. Crimes include but are not limited to: Assault, Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Kidnapping, Rape, Hit and Run, Theft, Identity Theft, etc.

How much do your services cost?

All services through the Victim Assistance department at APDC is free, but other services referred by victim assistance might have a fee.

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Referrals to mental health services
- Victim Compensation Assistance
- Interpretation and Translation
- Referrals to legal aid
- Information about Victim Rights
- Safety planning
- Legal and personal advocacy
- Development of self-care plan
- Direct victim services / case management
- Education and navigation of the criminal justice system
